Spring 2024 Community and Economic Development Grant Review Committee Meeting Notes – May 2, 2024

Attendees: Wesley Koklich (City of Milton Freewater), Dale Primmer (City of Pendleton), Dustin Schock (City of Ukiah), Tammie Williams (City of Echo), Maria Duron (City of Hermiston), Bob Waldher (Community Development Director)

The meeting began with a welcome and introductions from committee members.

Bob Waldher provided an overview of the grant program and outlined committee member responsibilities. It was discussed that grant funding decisions would be based on funding availability and consensus from committee members. Bob noted that not all of the money had to be spent each cycle and remaining funding could roll-over to future cycles if necessary. He also reminded the committee that grant funding should go to projects that enhance economic development and community livability. Events will not be funded through the program.

Final reports from previous grant recipients were shared with the group. Final reports included Milton-Freewater Junior Show (Spring 2023) and Milton-Freewater Community Development Partnership (Spring 2023)

It was shared that approximately \$70,000 was available this cycle. Some of the applications received were repeat applications from organizations that had received funding in previous cycles, but had not completed final reports. The committee agreed that those projects should not receive funding this round. Dale Primmer suggested that at least some focus be placed on getting funding to smaller communities that may not otherwise have the capacity to apply for other types of grants.

Each grant application was reviewed and discussed among committee members. Repeat applications that had not completed a final report and applications for events were removed from consideration.

After reviewing each of the projects and group discussion a recommendation was made to fund the following projects: Eastern Oregon Visitors Association, Holden Hearts Boutique, Saager's Shoe Shop, Stage Stop Motel & RV, Stay Around Donuts and Pies, Sweet Bee Honey Co., and White Eagle Grange. The group agreed by consensus to the funding recommendation which will be forwarded to the Board of Commissioners for consideration at their next meeting.

Bob noted that he would be reaching out to committee members to schedule the next meeting prior to the fall grant cycle deadline in October.
