Field Notes of Road No. 553.

Pendleton, Or. Oct. the 28th, 1903.  
Commencing at the S W Corner of Sec. 12 in T 5 N R 32 E W M Set post 4 feet long 4 in sq. 20 feet west of initial point marked R No. 553, dig pits N and S of post and made mound 18 in high 3 feet wide at base around post.

Thence I run north bet. secs. 11 and 12 T 5 N R 32 E W M 8025 chains to the N W Corner of sec. 12, T 5 N R 32 E W M.

Set post 4 feet long 4 in sq. S 45 ° W 45 lks. distant from terminus of Road marked R T No. 533; dug pits S and W of Post and built mound 18 in high, 3 feet wide at base around post, this the 26th day of Oct. 1903.

To the Honorable County Court of Umatilla County, Oregon.

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned viewers appointed, at the regular term of said Court in January 1904 to view, survey and lay out Road No. 555 beg lief to submit the following report.

We met the County Surveyor John W Kimbrell at the Court House in the City of Pendleton, Oregon as specified in our order and were by him each duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of our appointment, we called to our aid Brady Howdyshell and David Howdyshell as chainmen and Willi am Hessian as Flagman, who were by the surveyor each duly sworn. We viewed, surveyed and located said Road No. 555 as specified in our order, and find the Rout practicable, it is on an easy grade, will be a great convenience to the Public; one days work for each petitioner will put the road in good condition for travel; we therefore recommend the same be declared a public Highway of Umatilla County, Oregon.

We find the lands of ~~Anderson~~ Brown the S 1/2 of Sec. 32 would be rendered less valuable by reason of the location of ssaid road in the sum of \$89.85. The lands of Baker the W 1/2 of sec. 33, would be rendered less valuable by reason of this location of said road in the sum of \$182.75, One hundred and eighty two, seventy five.

Field Notes of Road No. 555.

Commencing at the N W corner of the S W 1/4 of Sec. 32 in T 3 N R 32 E W M set post 4x4 inches by 4 ft long 18 in in the ground N 45 ° 6' 35 feet dist. from Initial point of said road Marked R No. 555, dug pits N and E of post and raised mound of earth 18 in high 3 feet base around post.

Thence East through center No. 32 80 chains one mile set post 4x4 ins 4 feet long 18-in in the ground, 20 feet north Marked l M; dug pits E and west and ~~raised~~ mound of earth 18 in high 3 feet base around post.

Thence east through center W 1/2 sec. 33 to center sec. 33 T 3 N R 32 E W M 40 chs. to terminus of said road; set post 4x4 ins. by 4 feet long marked R T No. 555, 18-in in the ground and dug pits N and S and raised mound of earth 18 ins. high 3 feet base around post.
