To the Honorable County Court, of the State of Oregon, for Umatilla County:

We, the undersigned, the Board of County Road Viewers, heretofore appointed to view and locate Road No. 565, submit the following report: Pursuant to an order of the Honorable Court, we met John W Kimball, Surveyor, at Court House in Pendleton, on Nov. the 21st, 1904, and were by him, each, duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of our appointments.

We viewed, surveyed and located said Road No. 565, as specified in our order, we find the rout practicable; very much needed for the convenience of the Public, and would most respectfully recommend the same to be established as a public highway, the expense of opening the same for travel would be about \$20.00; The lands of H A Faxon to-wit: the S 100 rds of the SW 1/4 Sec. 27, S 2 N R 32, E W M, would be less valuable by reason of the location of said road in the sum of \$15.00; the lands of H C Dunn, to-wit: the N 60 rds of the SW 1/4 of Sec 27, T 2 N R 32, E W M would be rendered less valuable by reason of the location of said road in the sum of \$15.00.

Field Notes of Road No. 565.

Commencing at a point 100 rods North of the SE corner of the SW 1/4 of Sec. 27, in T 2 M R 32, E W M, set post 4 feet long, 4 ins. square, 18 inches in the ground marked R No. 565, dug pits N & s of Post and made mount 18 ins. high 3 feet Post. Thence West 3690 chs. to a point on County Road No. 482, at angle No. 1 and 60 rds. South of commencement of said Road No. 482, set post 4 feet long 4 inches square, 20 feet south of termines, marked R T No.565.

THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH: That we, S F Harrington, Alice Harrington, husband and wife, for the consideration of the sum of One Dollars, to us paid, have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey unto Umatilla County, State of Oregon, for a public highway, the following described premises in Umatilla Co. State of Oregon, to-wit: Beginning at the Northwest corner of the school grounds belonging to school Dist. No 9, Umatilla Co. Oregon, and conveyed to said district by deed executed by George M DeHaven and Louisa C Dehaven, his wife, on the 29th day of October, 1885, and recorded on the 28th day of June, 1889, at 10 o'clock A M in Book W records of deeds on page 256; running thence south, along the West line of said school grounds, 270 feet to the Southwest corner of said school grounds; thence West 354 ft. to the County road; thence North 40 ft; thence East 314 ft. thence North 230 feet; thence East 40 feet to the place of beginning; above description is intended to convey a strip of land 40 feet wide along the west side of aforesaid school grounds; thence West At right angles to the County County road; same to be used as a public highway, and in lieu of the road connecting the two ends of this strip of lands,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described and granted premises with the tenements, appurtenances and hereditaments thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining unto the said Umatilla County and its legal representatives. And we, S F Harrington and Alice Harrington, husband and wife, grantors above named, do covenant to and with Umatilla County, State of Oregon, and its legal representatives, that the above granted premises are free from all incumbrances made, executed or suffered by said grantors, and that we will and our heirs, executors and administrators, shall warrant and forever defend the above granted premises, and every part and parcel thereof, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever, claiming the same by from, through or under said grantors.
