And after due proclamation of the opening of Court by the  
proper officers, the following business was transacted together  
with claims allowed as shown by Abstract of Claims Book # 2.

In the matter of County Road No. 456. Commencing  
at the section corner for Secs. 28, 29, 32 & 33, Twp 6, N of Range  
35, E. N. M. running thence E on sec line 3/4 miles, more or  
less to intersect the county road known as the Middle  
Road leading from Milton, Oregon to Walla Walla, Wash.;  
thence in a westerly direction on said road one mile, more  
or less to the 1/4 section post on section line between Secs.  
24 and 25 in Twp 6 N. of Range 35 E. N. M.; thence E on said  
sec line 90 rods, more or less to the E bank of the Tumatum  
river; thence in a southerly direction along the east bank of  
said river to a point 30 rods south of sec. line between Secs  
24 and 25 aforesaid; thence E 140 rods, more or less to intersect  
county road known as the upper Road leading from  
Milton, to Walla Walla, Wash.; thence north on said road  
30 rods to sec line between sections 19 and 30 Twp 6 N of Range  
36 E. N. M.; thence E on said sec line 1 1/4 miles, more or less  
to intersect county road leading to Spofford Station on the  
O. R. & N. R. R., all in Umatilla County, State of Oregon.

now on this day comes the  
report of the viewers, heretofore appointed to view out and assess the  
damages in the cases of those persons having claims in for  
damages to their lands by reason of the location of the proposed  
county road # 456, through the same, assessing said damages at  
\$15.00 to C. G. Hafner, and in the case of Nancy Patterson and J. W.  
Arnold finding no damages to assess, and the matter coming up for  
final hearing the same having been read on a previous day, to-  
wit: the July term, 1895; and the said viewers having reported favorably  
and recommended the establishing of the same as a county road and  
the field notes and plat of survey being duly on file and certified to

by the Surveyor appointed to survey the same

It is therefore considered, ordered and adjudged by the Court that the said Road be established as a County Road in accordance with the report of said viewers, field notes and plat of survey thereof be recorded as by law required, and road ordered opened when damages assessed by viewers are paid by the Petitioners.

Now there being no further business coming before the Court at this time and the Journal having been read, approved and signed whereupon Court adjourned until tomorrow morning at 7:30 o'clock, a.m. Saturday, July 6<sup>th</sup>, 1895.
