

To The Hon County Court

Umatilla County Oregon.

We the undersigned appointed by your Honorable body at the September 1886 term of said County Court to view and assess the damages to the land and premises of Thos Bishop, E.M. Peck, Wm Reynolds, M.J. Harris, J.C. Long, N. Taylor, Chas Maybee, G.W. Long and B. Stanton by reason of the establishment of road no 267 through their respective lands, Beg leave to report as follows:

That we met at Adams on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of October 1886 and after being each severally duly sworn and subscribing the oath hereto annexed we did proceed and view said proposed road the whole distance through the several premises of Thos Bishop, E.M. Peck, Wm Reynolds, M.J. Harris, J.C. Long, N. Taylor, Chas Maybee, G.W. Long and B. Stanton and each of them and we did find assess and determine that the premises of Thos Bishop would be rendered no less valuable by the opening of said road, and that he should be allowed no damages therefor

And that the premises of E.M. Peck would be rendered no less valuable by the opening of said proposed road and that he should be allowed no damages therefor

10 be rendered no less valuable by the opening  
11 of said proposed road and that he should be al-  
12 lowed no damages therefor.

13 And that the premises of H. Taylor would  
14 be rendered no less valuable by the opening  
15 of said proposed road and that he should  
16 be allowed no damages therefor.

17 And that the premises of Chas May be  
18 would be rendered no less valuable by  
19 the opening of said proposed road and  
20 that he should be allowed no damages  
21 therefor.

22 And that the premises of G. W. Long  
23 would be rendered no less valuable by the  
24 opening of said proposed road and that  
25 he should be allowed no damages therefor.

26 And that the premises of B. Stanton  
27 would be rendered no less valuable by the opening of said  
28 proposed road and that he should be allowed no damages therefor.
