MONUMENT SET:

I accepted intersection of field lines extending East and South as best remaining evidence of original corner position. At the re-established corner position, set a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 2 1/2" x 30" galvanized iron pipe with cap 20" below ground level, marked as shown in Monument Marking Detail. In setting this monument, we dug up an old rotted fence post at the accepted corner point, about 2 feet below ground.

New accessories:

A silver deep-1 magnet bears North 34° East, 29.7 feet. A purple deep-1 magnet South 44° East, 30.4 feet. A blue deep-1 magnet South 34° West, 43.8 feet. An orange deep-1 magnet bears North 49° West, 32.3 feet.

Deep 1 magnets are buried 20" below ground line in wheat fields. Buried bearing object signs with the deep-1 magnets. Nailed "witness" sign to railroad tie post 7 .5' South of monument.

LOCATION AND COMMENTS: Corner is located at a rounded field corner with field lines East and South. There a few railroad ties extending East and South of corner point.
