| <p>The soil in this Tp. is below the average, being principally of 3rd rate quality, in the hills; and table land. It is adapted to the growth of bunch grass. On the extreme N. part of the Tp. it is composed of heavy sand, producing but little vegetation, except the prickly pear, which grows here in abundance.</p> |  |
