That portion lying to the south and West of said creek is embraced in the Umatilla Reservation for the Indians consequently not subject to settlement.

This Reservation embraces perhaps the best lands in all this region of Country.

On Dry Creek there are claims in this Township. Therefore this township ought to subdivided also a portion of Township No 3 N. R. 35 East, and all of 4 N. 37 East.

The lands in these Townships are valuable for the timber.
