- 40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post.
- 79.90 Intersect N. & S. line, 15 lks. W. of post Cor. for Secs. 5, 6, 31 & 32; from which, I run S.6' E. on true line.
- 39.90 Set $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post; drove charred stake; dug pits & raised mound, as per instructions.
- 79.90 To post Cor. for Secs. 5, 6, 7 & 8.
Land; broken.
Grass good.
Soil; 2nd rate.

 General Description.

The lands in this Tp. are generally high and rolling. Soil is good 2nd rate, sustaining a fine growth of grass.

Already stock raisers are looking to these lands for pasturage; in the N.E. Cor. there are claimants and along Dry Creek, settlers are taking claims.

The bottoms along Dry Creek & Pine Creek, are very narrow but rich.

On Pine Creek, there is considerable timber for fuel, consisting of pine, balm, alder and birch.
