The UCTAC also prioritized projects based off of the goals of the Coordinated Human Services Plan. Public Transportation Service Providers and other sub-recipients were present at the public UCTAC meetings where the evaluations and prioritization were provided. The UCTAC's decision was a recommendation to the Umatilla County Board of County Commissioners, the QE's governing body, who adopted the recommended STIF plan projects and project amounts.
